Heating

This year will see two installations of central heating. One in the Church and the other in the Church Hall. Both will result in a much improved system. The Church is having an up to date oil fired installation, consisting of sixteen radiators which are supposed to bring the temperature of the building up to 60 degrees (16C) in eight hours. The Church Hall is likely to be heated electrically and will cost the Parochial Church Council £200. Since the Hall is used for a variety of purposes unconnected with the Church and is let at a very uneconomic rental it is only right that we should issue an appeal for help in paying the bill. We try and make the hall pay for itself, but this is becoming increasingly difficult owing to the drop in lettings and we therefore have little in hand for emergencies. The £200 required is being borrowed by the PCC and will have to be re-paid.
